



Mr. Andrew Mack Higgins

February 9, 1929 - June 11, 2025

Andrew Mack Higgins was born on February 9, 1929, to the late Louis and Hattie Holloway Higgins. He was the fifth of nine children and was preceded in death by his beloved siblings: Christina Anderson, William Higgins, Lillian Munday, Mary Bentley, James Higgins, Charles Higgins, Anne Gray, and Russell Higgins.

Andrew attended public schools in Nicholasville, Kentucky. At the age of nine, he accepted Christ at Polk Memorial Baptist Church in Mortonville, Kentucky. In the early 1950's, he united with Bethel Baptist Church in Lexington, Kentucky, under the late Reverend Walter Taylor. His unwavering faith and dedication led to his ordination as a deacon in the late 1980's. He later joined First Baptist Church Bracktown, where he faithfully served as a deacon under the pastoral leadership of Dr. C.B. Akins Sr., Pastor Emeritus, until Deacon Higgins retirement. Deacon Higgins was honored with the title of Deacon Emeritus in 2017, a testament to his lasting spiritual guidance and commitment.

Andrew was a proud veteran of the United States Army. He dedicated 30 years of service to the U.S. Postal Service before retiring. Additionally, he worked as a driver for Bluegrass Tour Bus Services, ensuring safe travels for many.

In 2018, his devoted nieces and nephews; Renard Moore, Ricky Gray, Nizida Williams, Nicole Seals, Catrece Madison, Tim Higgins, and Bengie Marks stepped up to care for him in every way possible. In July 2019, Andrew relocated to Georgia to live with his niece Joyce Marks, great-niece Janet Hill, and great-nephew-in-love, Antwane Hill.

He leaves behind cherished memories with his five daughters and one son: Clara, Charlotte, Regina, Nerita (Kenneth Fairbanks), Velissa, and Michael. He is also survived by his sisters-in-love, Anita Higgins of Lexington and Sarah Higgins of Cleveland, Ohio, along with a host of grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins, and dear friends. A special friend, Mrs. Billie Jean Gray, also holds a meaningful place in his legacy.

Affectionately known as “Uncle Buck,” Andrew Mack Higgins lived a life rooted in faith, service, and love. His warmth, wisdom, and unwavering devotion to family will be dearly missed but forever remembered.
