Arsenio, affectionately known as "Ceno" and "Jr.," was a bright light in the lives of all who knew him. A junior at Henry Clay High School, he was well-loved by his teachers, classmates, and friends. His warm smile and kind spirit made him a friend to all, and he had a gift for making those around him feel welcomed. Ceno was Christened at Greater Liberty Baptist Church, where later in life he professed his hope in Christ.

A passionate football player, Ceno's love for the game started early with the Bearcats and Ravens little league teams and continued into his teenage years with the Frederick Douglass Broncos. His dedication and enthusiasm for the sport was reflected

in his determined and energetic nature. Off the field, Ceno was the heart of his home, embracing his role as a big brother with pride—whether that meant protecting, teasing, or simply being there for his younger siblings. His parents' homes were always filled with laughter and friendship, as he naturally brought people together.
