Lynette served in several nursing environments including area hospitals and dialysis centers. With decades of nursing experience, Lynette later joined the Health Department as a school nurse.

Though Lynette was born with a best friend, she also found a friend in Jesus. Lynette decided to follow Him at the age of 6. She was baptized at Historic Pleasant Green Missionary Baptist Church where she served faithfully. While both were serving as Young Adults, David Anthony “Tony” Laine found his “more than rubies” (Proverbs 3:15). Later becoming Rev. Tony and Mrs. Lynette Laine. Lynette was up for the adventure of wife and mother of The Laine Family; that included daughters Shelley, Shannon, son David and her four pawed baby, Goldie.
