



Mrs. Rosie Viola Briscoe

January 18, 1924 - May 15, 2020

Rosie “Viola” Starkey Briscoe was born on January 18, 1924 in Franklin County, Virginia to the late Albert M. Starkey and Rosie Terry Starkey, the eldest of ten children. Viola transitioned from her earthly vessel on Friday, May 15, 2020 at her home surrounded by her loved ones. She was fondly known by many as “Ms. Vi,” “Mrs. Briscoe,” “Dr. Vi” or “Girlfriend.”

At a young age, Viola accepted Christ and became a member of Hales Ford United Methodist Church in Moneta, Virginia. She moved to Harlem, New York where she married her husband, the late William A. Briscoe Jr. on October 26, 1947. Shortly thereafter, they moved their family to Lexington, Kentucky to be closer to family. Viola Briscoe joined Quinn Chapel AME Church where she was a dedicated and faithful member. She was a Sunday School teacher and a member of the Usher Board. She was well known by church members for wearing a variety of stylish Sunday church hats, some uniquely designed by her.

Viola was a stay-at-home mom who was very proud of her children. She always found an opportunity to brag to others about their accomplishments. She was a woman of boundless energy and worked tirelessly as a full-time homemaker to help support her family. She would babysit her grandchildren and other children who lived in the neighborhood. She was the “neighborhood doctor” that had a home remedy to cure any pain or fix any injury with tender

love and care. Her mother taught her to sew at an early age and she went on to become an extremely talented seamstress making alterations, clothing items and let's not forget her famous cabbage patch doll series. In her spare time, she enjoyed arts and crafts, gardening (Ms. Green Thumb), cooking, and in her later years she enjoyed watching basketball games and traveling, both domestically and internationally. Viola lived a full life and lived it her way with God, church and family first.

In addition to her parents and her husband, she was preceded in death by five brothers, Milton Starkey, Lloyd Starkey, Leonard Starkey, James Lee Starkey and Albert Starkey, and two sisters, Mattie Barnett and Eulalar Taylor.

She leaves to mourn and cherish her memories eleven children including five daughters, Barbara Goode of Richmond, Virginia, Rosalind Cater, Carmon (Sherman) Stout, Delphine (Marvin) Wilson and Corrice Patterson all of Lexington, Kentucky; and six sons, William A.
