



## Mrs Valtza Worsham Mabson

Elect Lady Valtza Worsham Mabson was born to the late Lady Addie C. Brown and Allen Bradshaw on March 12, 1933, in Lexington, Kentucky. She passed into eternal rest on Friday, July 2, 2021.

She attended Fayette County Public Schools and was a graduate of the original Dunbar High School.

As a teenager, she met the handsome Oliver R. Mabson while he was visiting his cousin, Mary Frances. A year into their courtship he was drafted into the United States Army. When he returned four years later, they were married on October 22, 1952. To this union was born seven beautiful children and later a spiritual daughter.

Lady Mabson was brought into the church as an infant by her mother under the pastorate of the late Bishop S.L. Henry, and continued her membership under the late Bishop S.P. Rawlings. She had remained a faithful member under

Chief Apostle T.E. Clark, Jr. until her passing. She served the church in a multitude of capacities on both the local and the national level.
